## The Sightseeing

Travel in air conditioned comfort through the **Atherton Tablelands**, across **dry plains**, **rolling hills**, and into lush World Heritage Listed **Wet Tropics Rainforest**

The comprehensive tour narration informs you about the region, its history, geography and all about the crops grown, the past, and present as well as insights into the future.



**Mareeba's** dry plains are fascinating, and rarely visited by other tours. Expect to see stunted eucalypts, termite mounds, and granite outcrops.



See historic buildings, including our lunch venue, the Tolga Hotel. Other buildings include a number of art-deco buildings in **Atherton** and Mareeba.



Between Atherton & **Yungaburra** travel through farmlands and between the **Seven Sisters**. Farmlands change from cropping to dairy.



Between the Seven Sisters and **Lake Barrine** the landscape changes again, with rolling hills and lush green pastures ideal for fattening cattle.



In the Lake Barrine district there are numerous volcanic cinder cones and volcanic crater lakes.

Afternoon tea overlooking **Lake Barrine** is a very relaxing, and idyllic way to finish the day.

Near Lake Barrine you will be amazed by the immense size of these 1000 year old, **Kauris** located in a piece of remnant rainforest



The Cathedral Fig Tree is another giant of the rainforest reputed to be over 500 years old. It has a canopy covering 2000 square meters.

The **Atherton Tablelands** produces many gourmet foods. You will **Taste Paradise** in more ways than one. Food, wine, farms, producers and sightseeing.

The tour narration covers growing, harvesting and processing of foods from the various farms we visit as well as other regional foods. All sell products under their own brand.



A tropical climate does not allow us to produce wine from grapes. Here they produce both still, fortified wines and creams from tropical fruits.



On a coffee plantation tour you meet the family, hear how coffee is grown, processed and roasted after which you will sample an amazing coffee.



Macadamia trees are native to Queensland. At a private farm you will learn about growing and processing this delectable nut. Taste them too.



The dairy farm you visit produces both cheeses and chocolates, which clients are able to sample, after an exclusive cheese making talk.



Enjoy a delectable tropical seafood lunch, which is included in the tour, as are product tastings throughout the day. *Alternatives are available.*



The afternoon's Devonshire tea features award winning scones, with local tea or coffee, served overlooking the Lake Barrine volcanic crater.
